## IMPORTANT NOTICE

### CHANGES ARE COMING TO CLEARWATER TRIBUNE ONLINE

The *Clearwater Tribune* is going to begin charging for access to our online paper.

We plan for paid access to take effect by the end of August.

When we begin charging for access, we will post a PDF of the complete issue of each week's new *Clearwater Tribune*. Some content will be posted separately and remain free to access, but the majority of articles will only be readable by viewing the PDF. Every article, photo, and ad that appears in the print edition will appear in the online PDF.

We plan to offer three types of subscriptions:

1. Online Only. 2. Print Only. 3. Combo.

1) Online Only. You will have complete access to *Clearwater Tribune* Online, but the paper will not be mailed to you. Prices are \$40 for 12 months, \$30 for 9 months, \$20 for 6 months and \$10 for 3 months.

2) Print Only. The paper will be mailed, but you will not have access to the paid section of *Clearwater Tribune* Online. Print subscription prices will remain the same.

3) Combo. In the case of Combo subscriptions, you will receive complete online access and the paper will be mailed to you. One-year prices for Clearwater County, Peck, and Lenore are \$49.50 regular rate and \$42.90 senior rate. Everywhere else will be \$59.80 regular and \$55.90 senior.

### Q: What are the benefits to paid online access?

A: There are many! 1. The new issue will be posted Wednesday evening, ready for viewing first thing Thursday morning. 2. No more waiting until Monday or Tuesday for the paper to show up in the mail. If you live out of the area, and have cancelled your subscription because your paper shows up a week late, or not at all, an online subscription is the perfect solution. 3. If you opt for a combo subscription, you can read the paper on the computer Thursday, and when it comes in the mail, you can still clip out and save your favorite articles. 4. ALL content will be posted, including things we currently do not put online, such as court news, letters to the editor, engagements, births, anniversaries and more. 5. The PDF, viewable using the FREE program Adobe Acrobat Reader, preserves the paper's original format. 6. We don't put limits on how many people can access our site with the same username and password. Buy one subscription and share it with your spouse and children. If you're a business owner, share access with your employees!

Watch the paper in the coming weeks for more information and on how these changes will affect you. We are in the process of learning the new system, and will keep you updated. A comprehensive FAQs sheet will be posted online later this month, and updated as we organize our system.
